METHOD


- 1. Set up the with Pirate Time banner and word cards.
- 2. Dress up as a pirate with your treasure map, hat and telescope.
 - 3. Read clue cards and look for treasure.
- 4. Take photos and add to the wall of the Pirate Time area.

PREPRATION WORK before doing this task


 Hide some toys (aka treasure) around the home for your little learner to discover. Look at the clue cards to know which toys to hide ahead of time.



Dramatic PLAY - Treasure Map Scavenger Hunt




Colour and cut this pirate hat and use as a prop while on the scavenger hunt.

Clue Card #1

I am something soft and fluffy and am often something you carry around.

A - comforter (like a personal treasure).

Clue Card #2

I am green and something that grows in the yard.

A - grass, tree, flower or plant

Clue Card #4

I am something you rest your head on when you are feeling tired.

A - pillow/cushion

Clue Card #3

I am filled with words and have a cover.

A = book (a pirate book would be a great link).

Clue Card #5

I am something you use to build with in play time. $\rm A-blocks$


- Cardboard cylinder (cut to suitable size for a telescope)
 - Black paper
 - ' Jewels template (next slide)
 - Glue
 - Scissors


METHOD

 Cover the carboard cylinder with black paper.
Cut out the jewels and paste them onto the telescope.
Use telescope as a prop when engaging in Pirate Time. WARNING — be mindful of your little learners walking with a telescope to their eye. I recommend children stop moving whilst using the telescope.

Dramatic PLAY - Telescope Craft BONUS Idea





- A tub/tray/treasure chest
- PLAY Sand (We use the playsand from Bunnings a local hardware store)
 - Scoops (toy spades)
- Jewels (jumbo sized sequins check out CleverPatch)

METHOD

- 1. Place sand in the base of the the tub/tray/treasure chest.
 - 2. Bury the jewels in the sand
- 3. Place scoops (spades) into the sand so learners can see the handle.
- 4. Encourage learners to dig and scoop for treasure (aka jewels).
- 5. Take photos and add them to your Pirate time area.
- Tag celebrate _play on Insta to have your set up featured in Stories.

- Playdough(store bought or DIY).
- Playdough Mats (next slides)


METHOD


- 1. Place playdough mats onto the play surface.
- 2. Place playdough into balls next to the mats.
- 3. Have the number 1 playdough mat on top/in front and have the playdough rolled to cover the number one. This will act as an example of what your little learners will/can do.































Pirate Time #4 craft Idea



You will need:

- Treasure Chest Template (next slide)
 - Dot Stickers or Dot Stampers

Crepe paper

Glue


• Scissors

METHOD


. Print treasure chest template out to the size you would like.

 Place dot sticker or dot markers into the treasure chest to make your very own treasure.
MODIFICATION IDEA — Peel off the backing paper of dot stickers so little learners can simply peel off the dot sticker with greater ease.

EXTENSION IDEA — Cut up coloured crepe paper into small squares and learners scrunch it up into a ball and cover their treasure chest with these.



WARNING - please ensure using a telescope is safe for your learner.


