
In this resource you will find:

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toddler The daily PLAY Plan instructions

day of the week	instructions/explanation
]	Using the ingredients listed in the resource list make edible fingerpaint. Set it up in the highchair or in a lipped edged tray and watch your little one paint with heir fingers.
2	Colour pasta ahead of time or use what you have already. Place a series of pasta pieces with string/wool/laces (short lengths) onto a flat surface and show your little one how to thread the pasta onto the thread. Watch your little one thread the pasta.
3	WATCH THE MASTERCLASS
4	Use musical bottles you already have or make a new set by filling each bottle with a different coloured rice. Fill bottles halfway and ensure bottle lids are well secured (we love to hot glue ours shut).
5	Using a puzzle you have at home, wrap each piece in wrapping paper and sealed shut with tape. Watch your little one unwrap each puzzle piece. Extension — complete the puzzle.
6	Place a piece of clear contact onto a window or wall. Secure it with tape. Provide loose natural parts into a basket, tray and or bowl and encourage your little one to stick it to the contact. Together you will create a masterpiece.
7	Set up the felt board and pieces as an invitation on a flat surface. Pop the pieces in a basket or tray for easy viewing and access. Place the piece on the felt board. Extension — tell a story as the pieces are put onto the board.
8	Cook spaghetti and let it cool down. Splash it with a little oil (of your choice) to stop it from sticking. Place the spaghetti into a snaplock bag, with a few drops of food colouring and mix until spaghetti is coloured. Place the coloured spaghetti into a tray with fine motor tools. This works wonderfully as an invitation to play.
9	Collect a set of 10 plastic/paper cups and stack as skittles in bowling. Source a series of balls of a suitable and safe size for your little learner and bowl the ball to knock down the skittles 9paper/plastic cups).
10	Source a series of dinosaur figurines and hide them within the home or yard. Together go and find all the dinosaurs. You can carry a basket to pop the dinosaurs in as they are found.
11	Using your voice and body share a series of instructions for your little one to follow eg, Simon says put your hands on your head, Simon says cover your eyes.

12	Look at the photo album you have created in previous plans or start a new one. Place photos of family and friends and put them into an album. Look at	
	the album together, identifying family and friends by name.	
13	Face your little learner and show them some body actions. Encourage them to copy your actions.	
14	Fill a tray with a shallow amount of water, place a few plastic eggs into the tray and watch the eggs float. Use a scoop to collect them out of the water.	
15	Place a series of random holes into cardboard box (lid and/or bottom). Thread pipe cleaners through the holes.	
16	Set up washable paints into a tray or egg carton. Place a cotton wool ball into the paint and dab onto paper. Continue until artwork is complete.	
17	Pop on a set of your favourite tunes and shake those music bottles made earlier in the month.	
18	Use coloured oats or make a new batch (see bonuses in the portal for recipe). Place the oats in a tray or tub with fine motor tools and scoop and pour the oats into containers.	
19	Choose a set of your favourite tunes and sing them together.	
20	Choose a series of colours one at a time and go on a hunt looking for toys of that colour.	
21	Make cloud dough (see the bonuses in the play portal for a recipe). Set up cloud dough into a tub or tray and fine motor tools for scooping and pouring.	
2.2	Set up a large sheet of paper in the sunshine. Place a vehicle onto the paper and trace the shadow. Continue using different vehicles until paper is covered.	
23	Set up a set of blocks as an invitation to play eg, a tower, a pyramid.	
24	Source a series of outdoor toys and create an obstacle course either inside or outside.	
25	Head outdoors and look for objects that are of different shapes, eg, sun + circle, leaf looks like the shape of an eye,	
2.6	Go for a search and hunt together looking for your little one's favourite toys, collect them and pop them in a basket. Put them away together.
